CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Towne called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Chairman Towne led the Pledge of Allegiance.

SELECTMEN PRESENT / QUORUM: Chairman Jeff Towne, Vice Chair David Watson, II, Randy Clark, Geraldine Dixon and Justin Cote. Also present Town Manager James Rhodes, Deputy Town Clerk Shirley Bailey, Gerald Howard, Director Transfer Station/Recycling Center.

ACTION ITEMS.

Approval of Selectmen's Minutes – July 14, 2009

Selectman Clark moved Board approve minutes of the July 14, 2009 meeting, second by Selectman Dixon. Vote 5-0 Approved (Note: Selectman Justin Cote was absent from the 07/14/09 meeting)

Approval of Amended Purchasing Policy

Selectman Clark moved Board approve the Amended Purchasing Policy with an effective date of August 3, 2009. Second by Selectman Dixon. Following discussion among the Board members paragraph 7. (2) of the proposed policy was amended to delete the words "construction" and "and other such services ". Selectman Clark moved the amendment with Second by Selectman Dixon. Vote 4-1 Approved (Selectman Clark votes no). Main Motion: Vote 4-1 Approved (Selectman Clark votes no).

Resolution 09-11: Transfer Station/Recycling Center Fees

Selectman Clark moved Board adopt Resolution 09-11. Second by selectman Dixon. . After discussions with Gerald Howard, Director Transfer Station, the motion was withdrawn and second withdrawn. The Resolution will be brought back to the Board on August 11, 2009 with two changes. 1. Fee for 9. Commercial Haulers of Household Waste will be \$75.00 per ton. 2. An additional line 10. for Computers & Electronics/Lamps/Batteries/Ballasts/Mercury Devices to be determined by Universal Waste Services.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Limiting the use of the Police cruisers and Highway Plow Truck. Selectman Dixon and Selectman Watson discussed their positions. Other Selectmen weighed in. No further action.

CEO: Ongoing Cases. Town Manager discussed pending court case of Clinton v. Charles McIntyre that has been appealed by Mr. McIntyre to Superior Court.

Town Manager also discussed the Writ of Execution filed by the Town of Clinton on the properties of James Wells to protect the Town's interest in the \$7,789.93 judgment against Mr. Wells. The Writ of Execution needs to be re-filed every three years. Next filing no later than February 3, 2011.

SUPPLEMENTS AND ABATEMENTS - NONE

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Municipal Recycling Rate: Clinton received a rate of 30.70%. This is an increase of 4.03% from the previous year. Director Howard stated his belief that the use of Jail Inmates during the year contributed directly to the increase in the recycling rate.

First Park: Apportionment of 2008 / 2009 Real Estate Taxes. Clinton received a revenue check of \$5,801.21. Last year Clinton received a check for \$6,753.15 (2007 / 2008) and \$6,731.57 (2006 / 2007).

Transfer Station Recycling Center Attendant Hiring: Town Manager reported that there were 2 In-House candidates. Patrick LaGross was hired for the position. He started work on 7/28/09. Doug Hillman, Sr., who filled the Transfer Station / Recycling Center Attendant position temporarily with the passing of Duke Wheeler, was recalled from Lay-Off status with the Highway Department to fill the part-time laborer position in the Highway Department at 24-hours per week beginning August 4, 2009.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS:

WARRANT: Selectman Clark moved to approve warrant # 5 in the amount of \$106,556.00 . Second by Selectman Watson . Vote 5-0 Approved.

NEXT AGENDA ITEMS

Next meeting will be August 11, 2009. Agenda Items: Lime Mud Applications, Resolution 09-11, and Public Hearing on Special Town Meeting Warrant Article for Police Department funding.
